EASY TO USE

This rechargeable cordless device lets you perform your treatments anytime and anywhere, whether on the couch or in front of the computer. Its ergonomic design also covers up to nine square inches of the scalp at once, and features an LCD display that keeps track of time.

HOW TO USE IT Low-level laser light channels make direct contact with the scalp to stimulate hair growth with three 10- to 15-minute treatments per week. The X5 uses cold laser technology, so it does not emit heat or a snapping sensation like its hair-reduction counterparts.

WHAT IT FEELS LIKE

Even though our tester expected to feel some heat and discomfort, this hair growth stimulator was pain-free.
